

From humble beginnings...

The company started in 1921 when Busaburo Otsuka, a farmer's son broke with tradition and set up a factory manufacturing chemical raw materials.

By 1946, his son Masahito had turned the business into an IV solution company, distributing products to hospitals across Japan. Within 25 years, Otsuka became the largest supplier of intravenous solutions to hospitals in Japan.

In 1964, Otsuka Pharmaceutical Co., Ltd. was established. Otsuka has since grown from 10 people into a global organisation of 47,000 people (as of March 2023), with a core focus on pharmaceuticals and nutraceuticals.

Otsuka celebrated our dedication to improving health around the world for 100 years in 2021.




















Our global mission: Otsuka-people creating new products for better health worldwide




A culture led by our Japanese guiding principles





Our European therapy areas



Neuroscience

For over 30 years, we have worked in the area of mental health, focusing on treatments for schizophrenia and bipolar conditions. We work closely with Lundbeck and Sunovion to bring new treatment options to the millions of people affected by mental ill health across Europe.



Nephrology

We work with patients and healthcare professionals to increase awareness of kidney disease including autosomal dominant polycystic kidney disease (ADPKD) and together with Aurinia, are exploring treatment options for patients with Lupus Nephritis.



Haemato-oncology

With our partner Astex (acquired by Otsuka in 2013), we are currently focusing on haematological malignancies, such as acute myeloid leukaemia.



Specialty

We have been conducting research to identify medicines that help people affected by hormone-related conditions. One such condition is hyponatraemia which is abnormally low levels of sodium in the blood.



Digital Innovation

We are exploring how digital health technology may provide holistic health solutions for patients, carers and healthcare professionals.



Strategic relationships & alliances

Otsuka's global family consists of a number of different companies with varied portfolios and therapy areas, allowing us to offer wide ranging support to our patients and their carers.
